

Born January 16, 1933, Sr. Mary was the sixth of ten children born to Joseph G. and Caroline (Vetter) Gottsponer in Hattieville, AR. She finished her secondary education at Sacred Heart School where she was taught by the School Sisters of Notre Dame.

After profession of vows Sister taught children in primary and middle grades in several schools, eventually returning to her hometown of Morrilton where she was appointed elementary principal of Sacred Heart School for twelve years. In 1988, Sr. Mary became the first Arkansan to be recognized by the National Catholic Education Association with the

Distinguished Principal Award.

After 20 years as Principal of St. Peter Elementary School in Pine Bluff, Sister Mary retired to St. Mary of the Pines in 2004 where she assisted in the library and in the hobby shop for as long as her health allowed.

Sacred Heart Receives Grants for Security


Annual Fund Campaign Update

Alum of the Year Awards Given

This year's recipient for the Alumnus of the Year is

the Year Marguerite Hoelzeman Marguerite Thomey graduated from Sacred Heart School in 1948. She has worked full time in the Sacred Heart kitchen for over 37 years, but even during her high school days she worked in the lunch room.

Through the years Marguerite has served Sacred Heart in many capacities. She held a position on the school board, was an officer of both the Altar Society and the Booster Club. Marguerite has spent over 70 years working and volunteering at Sacred Heart School. She has seen many generations walk through the cafeteria over the years and her cooking Fresneda and Honorary Alumnus is legendary among Sacred Heart graduates.

For her tireless efforts and dedication to Catholic education, Sacred Heart is pleased to recognize Marguerite Hoelzeman as this year's Alumnus of the Year.

The Honorary Alumnus of the Year award was created to recognize individuals who, although they may not have attended and/or graduated from Sacred Heart, have shown great commitment and dedication to the school over the years. This year's recipient for the 2013-2014 Honorary Alumnus of the Year is Stan Willis.

Stan began his involvement with Sacred Heart in 1970 when he taught bookkeeping at the school in his first year out of college. During the 70's he also served on the Bazaar committee for seven years and he was one of seven men who reorganized the school board in order to keep the school open, despite the lack of subsidy from the parish and the pastor's intention to close Sacred Heart School. In 1986, he wrote the by-laws and started the Sacred Heart Endowment Fund with a gift of \$5,000 that was bequeathed by a deceased parish member. Today the Endowment Fund provides annual operating support for the school and is worth over \$1 million.

Stan has filled vital roles at the school and church over the years, including President of the School Board and member of the Parish Council and Booster Club. Stan is currently serving on the parish's Finance Committee, Cemetery Committee and Building and Grounds Committee and sings in the church choir. In 2011, he helped organize the "Friends of Sacred Heart" and helped lead the renovation of the former Youth Hall building where the pre-school now resides. Stan was also recently instrumental in raising the money and negotiating the purchase of property to increase the size of the Sacred Heart campus.

Sacred Heart is pleased to acknowledge Stan's years of service to Sacred Heart and to recognize him as this year's Honorary Alumnus of the Year.
